Series History

- ▶ Neenah leads the regular season series with Appleton North 31-9.
- ▶ Neenah leads the postseason series with Appleton North 1-0.
- ➤ Over the past 50 years, the only FVA school that Neenah has a better winning percentage against than Appleton North (.780) is Menasha (.825).
- ► The longest Neenah regular season win streak in the series is 9 games (1999-2003).
- ▶ The longest Appleton North regular season win streak in the series is 2 games (1996 & 2010-2011).
- ▶ Neenah's largest margin of victory (31 points) was in 2009 by the score of 60-29.
- ▶ Neenah's largest margin of defeat (25 points) was in 1995-96 by the score of 78-53. That game played at Appleton North was the first game ever played between these two schools.
- ▶ In the 41 total games that Neenah and Appleton North have played since 1995-96, only four games have gone to overtime. The Rockets have won all four of those games.

Tonight's Matchup



The Rockets conclude their three-game home stand tonight when they welcome head coach Jon Liesener and his Appleton North Lightning to the Ron Einerson Fieldhouse. Coach Liesener is in his first year of leading the Lightning program. The former Lawrence University assistant coach inherited a team that finished last in the FVA in the 2014-15 season with a 2-16 mark in league play and overall record of 3-19. The Lightning has had a tough season so far at 0-7 in the FVA and 2-9 overall for the season. Appleton North's two wins came during the holiday break when it defeated two small enrollment schools in Platteville (57-53) and Black Hawk (68-36). In FVA action the Lightning has had only two games decided by less than 10 points this season. Those games were against Oshkosh West (55-47) and Appleton West (36-31).

The Rockets return back to the hardwood tonight looking to extend their season high four-game winning streak. Last Friday night the Big Red defeated Oshkosh West 65-53. This was a strange game in which Neenah led for almost the entire first half, only to allow the Wildcats to finish the half on a 15-3 run to take a two point lead into the half (34-32). The Rockets came out in the second half and assumed control of the game, but never really put their foot on the throats of the Wildcats, allowing them to hang around for almost the entire second half. However, a win is a win, and the Rockets have put themselves in a position of power seven games into the FVA season. With a win tonight, Neenah would guarantee themselves, at worst, a tie for first place heading to Friday night's main event at FVA powerhouse Kaukauna.

Tonight's game will be interesting on one front. For most of the 10 games this year, Neenah has been an underdog. Tonight, that is not the case. How the Rockets take care of business tonight will show how far this team has grown and matured since the beginning of the season.

Turning Back the Clock

Tonight, rather than revisit a memorable game in the series history between Appleton North and Neenah, we are going to look back at another memorable team in Neenah's glorious basketball tradition. Tonight we will look back at the 1968-69 Neenah Rockets.

The 1968-69 season started with a lot of change. Ole Jorgensen retired after the 1965 season. Doug Martin left for Wausau after the 1968 season. In May of 1968 Neenah hired a gentlemen named Ron Einerson. Coach Einerson had been a head coach for two years at Cashton and 10 years at Plymouth before arriving at Neenah. He inherited a team that lost all five starters from the previous year. In his first team meeting he gave his team three goals for the year. They were to play as a team, win the conference title, and go to state. His players responded by laughing at him. By March, no one would be laughing at Coach Einerson or the Rockets.

Coach Einerson's first game at Neenah was a memorable one. The Rockets hosted rival Menasha, and it also happened to be the same night that the gymnasium at Shattuck would be named after former coach and current AD Ole Jorgensen. The Rockets handled the Bluejays 78-61 to start the year 1-0. In fact, the Rockets got off to a fine start winning their first eight games before losing back to back games to Green Bay West and Green Bay East. The Red and White would win their next five before falling to Manitowoc. Perhaps the most memorable game of the regular season was a rematch at Green Bay West on a cold February night. The Rockets would claim a 68-65 verdict in double overtime. Neenah would wind up their regular season with a 14-4 overall mark (12-4 in conference) and would share a portion of the Fox River Valley conference title with aGreen Bay East and Green Bay West. However, over the next decade, Neenah would be remembered most for what they did in March. Because, NO ONE during the next 10 years got the job done in March like the Neenah Rockets.

The Rockets began tournament play with convincing wins over Menasha (70-54), Montello (98-52), and Omro (84-75) to advance to the sectional. A 87-75 win over a very good Mayville team put the Rockets one game away from state. In the final the Rockets avenged an earlier season loss to Manitowoc by defeating the Ships on their home court 86-74. The third of Coach Einerson's three preseason goals was now accomplished. Play as a team, win conference, and go to state. At state Neenah would bump into Wausau and former Neenah Rocket head coach Doug Martin. Neenah took care of business 72-59 to advance to the semifinals. Then, Big Red defeated a talented Nicolet team 81-78 to advance to the state title game to play Beloit. Many historians consider the 1969 state title game a classic. Despite playing without starting point guard Tom Ponto the Rockets battled undefeated and favored Beloit for four quarters and two overtimes before falling 80-79. The game included a desperation heave that went into the net with two seconds to go in regulation to put the game into overtime. The Rockets finished the season 21-5 and state runner-up. Perhaps Neenah's love affair with this 1969 team is best summarized here. On the way back from Madison, Rocket fans met the team on Highway 41 in Oshkosh and lined up bumper to bumper all the way up to Neenah to welcome home their team. Once in Neenah there were over 6000 fans at the Fox Point Shopping Plaza to show Coach Einerson and his players how much Neenah loved its Rockets.
