Series History

- ▶ Neenah leads the regular season series with Appleton West 62-35.
- ▶ Neenah leads the WIAA post season series with Appleton West 3-2. The Terrors won the first 2 (1967 Regional and 1970 WIAA State Title game) and the Rockets have won the last 3 (1972 & 1993 Regional, 1974 Regional Final).
- ► The longest Neenah regular season win streak in the series is 6 games (1974-1976 and 1996-1998).
- ► The longest Appleton West regular season win streak in the series is 4 games (2002-2003).
- ► Neenah's largest margin of victory (40 points) was in 1998 by the score of 71-31
- ► Neenah's largest margin of defeat (27 points) was in 1993 by the score of 80-53.
- ▶ In the 102 total games that Neenah and Appleton West have played since 1965-66, only four games have gone to overtime. One was last Saturday's double overtime thriller. Another was a four-overtime battle between the Rockets and Terrors in the 2001-02 FVA conference opener when the Terrors prevailed 68-66 at the Dick Emanuel Gymnasium.

Tonight's Matchup



Tonight the Rockets welcome head coach Brennan Hussey and his Appleton West Terrors to the friendly confines of the Ron Einerson Fieldhouse for the regular season home finale. After tonight, Neenah will conclude the 2016-17 regular season next Thursday when it travels to Kimberly to face the Papermakers. This Sunday, the Rockets will learn their seed in their 16-team WIAA sectional. The WIAA tournament will begin on Friday, March 3.

The 2016-17 season has been an interesting adventure for the Appleton West basketball program. The Terrors have had some impressive wins over teams like Bay Port and defending Division 2 state champion Kaukauna. They have also experienced some odd losses to Oshkosh West and Hortonville. However, make no mistake about it, this Terror team is tall, athletic and talented. The Rockets got a firsthand look at that athleticism and skill last Saturday night when Big Red survived a double overtime battle against the Terrors 77-76 in a game that had more drama, twists and turns than a CBS Sunday night movie. The Terrors are led in scoring by the Mahoney brothers. Big brother Jack (#0) is a 6'7" senior forward who averages 14 points per game. Younger brother Will (#21) is a 6'0" sophomore guard who also averages 14 points per game. Appleton West also has three other perimeter players than can score in (#3) junior Pinder Singh, (#30) junior Blake Pahlow, and (#15) senior Carter Bell. Don't forget, the Terrors also have senior big man (#33) Joey Reader in the post. All four of these players average between 7-10 points per game for the Terrors.

The Rockets went 2-0 since their last home game eight days ago. As mentioned above, the Men of Rabas defeated the Terrors last Saturday night in double overtime 77-76. On Tuesday night, Neenah traveled to Appleton North and defeated the Lightning 72-53. The Rockets overcame a pathetic first half performance of basketball before putting away the Lightning in the second half. The Big Red Machine went on a 17-2 spurt midway through the second half to take control of the game and eliminate any potential possibility of an upset. As the Rockets have done a number of times throughout the season, Neenah was solid from the charity stripe, connecting on 28 of 35 attempts Tuesday night in Appleton.

Tonight is a special night at Neenah since it is the final time that eight young men will wear their Neenah jersey for a regular season home game. The Class of 2017 is the largest senior class at Neenah since nine seniors graduated off of the 2000 sectional champion team. These players are Josh Mericle, Joe Jung, A.J. Dehn, Sam Borchers, Jordan Mascal, Zavier Sims, Anthony Bartman, and Greg Lenhart. Please give these young men a nice round of applause tonight for their contributions to the Neenah basketball program. There was very little expected from this team from media preseason predictions. This team overcame injuries and other issues to post at least a .500 record in the FVA (with two games to go) and turned out to be the most surprising team in the conference this year. Congratulations to Coach Rabas, his staff and the 2017 Neenah basketball team on their performance during the regular season.

Turning Back the Clock

Tonight we are going back 17 years to the 2000 season for a regular season game between Neenah and Appleton West. On Saturday night, February 19, 2000, Appleton West recognized its 1970 WIAA state champion basketball team, and also named its gymnasium after former head coach Dick Emanuel. Since Appleton West had defeated Neenah in the 1970 title game, the Rockets were the lucky opponent on this evening of commemoration for the Terrors. Just in case anyone from Neenah had forgotten the score of the 1970 title game, Appleton West left the score (58-57) on the scoreboard for the entire pregame recognition ceremony.

The 2000 Rockets were led by first year head coach Scott Anderson. He had a core of three senior stars that were back together for their third year of varsity basketball (Sam Oatman, Aaron Shaw and Derek Huebner). The Rockets entered the game at 12-4 in the FVA and 14-4 overall which was good for third place in the FVA (trailing only state ranked powers Oshkosh West and Fond du Lac). The Terrors fed off the emotion of the evening and a sellout crowd and took a 19-15 lead after eight minutes of action. Tim Haack led the charge for Appleton West scoring six of his 16 total points in the first quarter. Appleton West maintained the momentum in the second quarter as it outpaced the Rockets by two points (17-15) to take a 36-30 lead into the half. Terror Justin VanderWyst scored eight of his team-high 22 points in the second quarter for the blue and orange. Neenah began to take command in the third quarter behind 10 points from Shaw (first-team all-FVA) and eight points from Oatman (first-team all-FVA).

The Rocket defense held Appleton West to only 12 points in the third quarter and built a 50-48 lead after 24 minutes of action. Big Red continued to pull away from the Terrors in the fourth quarter. The key to the Neenah second half performance was Huebner (third-team all-FVA). The 6'5" senior wide body was a dominant presence in the post scoring 10 of his 17 total points for the night in the final quarter against future Wisconsin Badger Brian Butch. The Rockets converted their free throws late in the game and marched out of Appleton with a hard fought 73-64 victory over a gamed Terror squad. Neenah was led in scoring by their big three guns of Shaw (28 points), Huebner (17 points) and Oatman (16 points). The Rockets continued to play solid basketball and finished the regular season 14-4 in the FVA and 16-4 overall. In the WIAA tournament they destroyed SPASH in a regional final (69-51), outlasted Wisconsin Rapids in the sectional semifinal (52-38) and defeated Fond du Lac in overtime (53-50) to earn their first trip to Madison since 1988.

Since tonight is the regular season home finale, this story wraps up another year of "Turning Back the Clock." We hope you've enjoyed the weekly trip down memory lane. Until next November, NEENAH WITH PRIDE
