Series History

- ▶ Neenah leads the regular season series with Appleton North 30-9.
- ▶ Neenah leads the post season series with Appleton North 1-0.
- ▶ Over the past 50 years, the only FVA school that Neenah has a better winning percentage against than Appleton North (.775) is Menasha (.825).
- ► The longest Neenah regular season win streak in the series is 9 games (1999-2003).
- ► The longest Appleton North regular season win streak in the series is 2 games (1996 & 2010-2011).
- ▶ Neenah's largest margin of victory (31 points) was in 2009 at 60-29.
- ▶ Neenah's largest margin of defeat (25 points) was in 1995-96 by the score of 78-53. That game played at Appleton North was the first game ever played between these two schools.
- ▶ In the 40 total games that Neenah and Appleton North have played since 1995-96, only four games have gone to overtime. The Rockets have won all four games.

Tonight's Matchup



Tonight the Rockets welcome head coach Eric Eastman and his Appleton North Lightning to the friendly confines of the Ron Einerson Fieldhouse for their regular season home finale. Next Thursday, the Rockets will travel to Kaukauna to conclude the 2014-15 regular season. This weekend Neenah will learn their tournament draw for the opening round of the WIAA tournament during the annual seeding meeting. Neenah will likely be a No. 2 seed and host a WIAA regional semifinal on Friday, March 6.

The 2014-15 basketball season has been a struggle for the Lightning after experiencing three consecutive winning seasons (first time in school history) from 2012-14. Coach Eastman brings the youngest roster in the FVA (11 underclassmen, including 7 sophomores) into Neenah tonight looking for their first road win of the 2014-15 FVA season. The Lightning has played better lately, as it has experienced its only two conference wins against Oshkosh West and Fond du Lac within the past three weeks. Offensively, Appleton North is led by three players that average between seven to nine points per game. Those three are junior guards Tony Mattiolo (9.1 ppg), Spencer Christensen (7.3 ppg) and senior forward Jacquan McGraw (7.9 ppg).

Tonight is a special night at Neenah since it will be the final time that six young men will wear their Neenah home jersey for a regular season game. These players are #2 Jake Aijala, #3 Ty Hegg, #4 Trevor Entwisle, #11 Harold Boccheciamp, #15 Adam Pronschinske, and #31 Matt Heldt. At the conclusion of tonight's varsity game, there will be a post game senior night ceremony where we will recognize all of the commitment, hard work, dedication, and time that these six student athletes have given to the Neenah boys' basketball program. We strongly encourage all fans to stay in their seats and recognize these fine young men that have represented our school on the court, in the classroom and in the community for the past two to three years. How successful has Neenah basketball been with these six seniors on varsity? During the past three seasons the Neenah Rockets have gone 45-7 in FVA competition and 60-11 overall. This will be the first time that Neenah has finished in the top three in the FVA in three consecutive seasons since 1987-89. If the Rockets win their final two conference games, it will be the first time since 1974-76 that the Rockets will have three straight seasons with three or fewer losses in the FVA. Now, some of you long time Neenah basketball historians might be asking about those outstanding teams from the 1980's? Yes, we had some really fine ball clubs that were FVA conference champions in 1981, 1982, 1985, and those back to back marvelous teams in 1987 and 1988 (which went 27-1 in the FVA over those two seasons). However, we never had a three year consecutive run of conference wins like this during the 1980's. Bottom line, anytime our current teams can be statistically compared to Coach Einerson's powerhouses of the 1970's, that is a significant achievement. Congratulations Jake, Ty, Trevor, Harold, Adam, and Matt.

Turning Back the Clock

Tonight we are going back one year and reflecting on the 2014 WIAA Regional Final between the Neenah Rockets and Appleton North Lightning played at the Ron Einerson Fieldhouse. This game is the only time in their 20-year rivalry that these two conference members have ever faced off in a WIAA tournament game. The Rockets entered the game as the FVA conference champions (22-1) and the top seed in the sectional. The Lightning (13-9) was the No. 5 seed in the sectional, and had come into this game as winners of seven of its last eight games. Neenah defeated Appleton East 41-27 to advance to this regional final. Meanwhile, Appleton North survived an overtime battle with cross-town rival Appleton West 54-50 to earn a ticket to the regional final. The Rockets had already defeated the Lightning twice during the regular season. In January, Neenah beat Appleton North 66-50 at home, and then the Rockets completed the sweep in February when they won in Appleton 55-37. Would the Rockets be able to beat a talented and experienced Lightning team three times in three months? As we all found out, the Rockets provided that answer within the first eight minutes of the regional final.

In quite possibly the most impressive offensive performance of any quarter all season long, Big Red hung 26 points on the Lightning during the first quarter of the regional final. The Rockets were a perfect 10-for-10 from the field and led the Lightning 26-11 after eight minutes of action, much to the delight of the Neenah Rocket fans. The Rockets were so efficient on offense that they scored on 11 of their 12 possessions in the first quarter. The Lightning fought back in the second quarter to cut the Rocket lead to 28-16. However, Neenah responded by clamping down on defense and ending the second quarter on a 12-0 spurt which extended the Rocket lead to 40-16 at the half. The Men of Bork did not let up in the third quarter. The Rockets eliminated any possibility of this game being competitive by opening the second half on a 20-10 run to expand their commanding lead to 60-26. Coach Bork emptied the bench in the fourth quarter and the Rockets earned another WIAA regional title with a convincing 66-42 win. Junior post Matt Heldt led a balanced Rocket offensive attack (four starters scored in double digits) with 16 points. With this victory the Rockets would march on to the sectional semifinal where they would meet up with Stevens Point. Neenah would have a comeback for the ages (down 36-21 at half) and defeat the Panthers 59-56 to advance to the sectional title game. The Rockets crushed Marshfield 54-31 to earn their 26th trip to Madison. At state, Neenah beat Mukwonago 58-41, before falling short to Germantown in the state title game. This story wraps up another season of the feature we call "TURN-ING BACK THE CLOCK." We hope you have both enjoyed and possibly even been educated by these magnificent memories of Neenah Rocket basketball. Until next November, NEENAH WITH PRIDE!
