TONIGHT'S Matchup

Good evening basketball fans and welcome to WIAA regional championship Saturday. Tonight the #2 seeded Neenah Rockets (21-2) welcome head coach Scott Scheuer and his #7 seeded (15-8) Marshfield Tigers to the friendly confines of the Ron Einerson Fieldhouse. The winner of tonight's regional final will advance to play the winner between #3 seeded Chippewa Falls and #6 seeded D.C. Everest next Thursday night at 7:00 p.m. in a WIAA sectional semifinal. That game will be on a neutral floor and is tentatively scheduled to be played at Appleton East, but an official site will be announced Monday.

The Tigers enter tonight's regional final fresh off a come from behind victory over conference rival SPASH (64-60). The win marked the third time the Tigers had beaten the Panthers this season. Marshfield got off to a bit of a slow start this season by losing five of its first nine games. However, once the calendar flipped to January the Tigers went on the prowl. It started with a convincing victory (53-35) over Chippewa Falls in Marshfield. The Tigers won four games in a row before dropping a two-point decision to Wisconsin Rapids (56-54). Marshfield then won its next two games before losing to eventual conference champion D.C. Everest (74-50). Following that loss, the Tigers closed out the regular season by winning four of their final five games. In all, the Tigers have won 11 out of their last 14 games. Offensively, the Tigers possess a balanced scoring attack. They are led in scoring by senior guard (#10, 6'2") Anthony Posteluk who averages over 15 points a game. However, Marshfield also has three other seniors in (#11, 6'3") Joey Goettl (13 ppg), (#2, 5'11") Addison Hill (10 ppg) and (#3, 5'10") Sam Hinson (9 ppg) that all contribute consistent scoring for the Tiger offensive attack.

The Rockets defeated Superior last night 88-62 to notch their 12th consecutive win (ninth consecutive win by 17 or more points) and earn their 21st victory on the season. The 21 victories is the most in a season since the 2014 Rocket juggernaut finished state runner-up at 26-2. The Rockets jumped on the Spartans early last night, getting out to a 14-6 lead four minutes into the first half. Following a Superior timeout, the Big Red went on a 22-9 run to stretch their lead to a 36-15 margin with seven minutes left in the first half. The Rockets eventually took a comfortable 47-22 lead into the locker room.

Neenah extended its lead to as much as 31 (80-49) in the second half. Ultimately, the final score ended up 88-62. The 88 points tied for the second-highest point total of the year for the Rockets, matching the total they deposited against Fond du Lac (88-57) and trailing only the 92 they hung on Kaukauna (92-63). Senior Max Klesmit led the Rockets scoring attack with 25 points while junior Jake Dietz added 15. The Rockets connected on 12 three-point baskets during the game against the Spartans. The win marked Neenah's seventh consecutive season that they have advanced to the regional final. It is still a few years short of their longest streak since 1960, when the Rockets advanced to nine consecutive regional finals between 1973/74-1981/82.

Tonight is the second night of March Madness. By 9:00 p.m. this evening, only 16 teams will still be alive for a berth in the Division 1 2020 state basketball tournament. While there is tremendous excitement around high school tournament basketball this time of year, there is also an increased level of pressure and anxiety. For the winner tonight there will be another week of practice and excitement for next Thursday's sectional. For the loser, the dream of playing in the Kohl Center in two weeks will be over forever. Winning in tournament competition is not about making fancy plays. It is about eliminating mistakes like bad shots, turnovers, missed box outs, a lack of intensity and mental concentration. The team that executes at a higher level will win tonight's game, not necessarily the team that is higher seeded or is playing in front of their home fans. The 2020 Neenah Rockets have done some remarkable things this season. However, the Rockets have still not played a complete game of 36 minutes of basketball on both the offensive and defensive ends of the court. Will tonight be that night?
