

FOX 11 ALL-AREA BOYS BASKETBALL TEAMS

PLAYER OF THE YEAR

Jackson Paveletzke, Kimberly. The junior led the Papermakers to the Division 1 state title game, and his efficiency was off the charts. The FVA player of the year shot 58% from the field, 56% from 3-point range and 87% from the free-throw line. He averaged 19 points and six assists per game, and he's back next year. Arguably, Paveletzke's best game came in a state semifinal, where he totaled 28 points, 10 rebounds, and 7 assists. His ability to get what he wants off the dribble was unmatched.

THE REST OF THE FIRST TEAM

Preston Ruedinger, Lourdes Academy. The senior led the Knights to the Division 4 state title, their first WIAA state title. The Trailways-East player of the year averaged 25.8 ppg., 7 rpg., 5 pg. and made 42 percent of his 3-point attempts. Ruedinger could score from anywhere and it showed in his final numbers as he ended his career with 2,349 points, 12th all-time in state history.

Mason Dopirak, Manitowoc. The senior led the FRCC in scoring at 27 ppg., and scored more than 20 points in all but one game (16 of 17 games). The senior, who is committed to Colorado School of Mines, finished his career with 1,776 points, most in program history.

Mason Dorn, Seymour. After averaging more than 24 points per game last season, Dorn averaged 27.5 ppg. and added 8 rpg., while being named the Bay Conference player of the year. The senior had a great mid-range game, but could also score from deep. Dorn finished as the school's all-time leading scorer with 1,749 career points.

Marcus Tomashek, Ashwaubenon. The junior was only second to Dopirak in the FRCC in scoring at 23.4 ppg., and scored at least 15 points in 24 of 25 games played. The guard was an all-conference selection in leading Ashwaubenon to a 20-win season, and he played his best late in the season averaging 27.4 ppg. in his final five games.

Johnny Kinziger, De Pere. The sophomore averaged 22.5 ppg. He did it without being a volume shooter. Kinziger made 45% of his 3-point attempts and 88% of his free throws. He might be young, but Kinziger plays beyond his years, which is why Division I schools are interested in him.

Jackson Paveletzke, Jr., Kimberly: 19.2 ppg. 6.1 apg. FVA ad FOX 11 player of the year.

Preston Ruedinger, Sr., Lourdes Academy: 25.8 ppg., 6.9 rpg., 5 apg. Trailways-East player of the year led the Knights to the Division 4 state title.

Marcus Tomashek, Jr., Ashwaubenon: 23.4 ppg. The guard was a first-team All-FRCC selection.

Johnny Kinziger, Soph., De Pere: 22.5 ppg. In two seasons, Kinziger already has 983 career points.

Mason Dorn, Sr., Seymour: 27.5 ppg., 8.1 rpg., 4.1 apg. Ranked fifth in the state in scoring and made 56% of his shots.

Mason Dopirak, Sr., Manitowoc: 27 ppg. 8th in the state in scoring. 92-112 at the free-throw line (82%).

SECOND TEAM

Sam Haese, Sr., Wrightstown: 19 ppg., 7.2 rpg. Help lead team to the state tournament for the first time, and an all-NEC selection.

Luke Pautz, Jr., Roncalli: 20 ppg., 12.7 rpg. Player of the year in the Eastern Wisconsin Conference.

Donavan Short, Jr., Denmark: 21.7 ppg., 8.8 rpg. Topped 40 points in three games this season. Has multiple Division I offers.

Grant Asman, Sr., Kimberly: 15 ppg., 6.6 rpg. Despite being 6-11, tied for team led with 49 threes as he could go inside and outside. Committed to Lipscomb.

Alex Sherwood, Soph., Xavier: 17.4 ppg. 10.4 rpg. All-Bay Conference pick led Hawks to Division 2 state tournament.

Jeremy Lorenz, Soph., Brillion: 19.1 ppg., 10.6 rpg. Third in Eastern Wisconsin in scoring, and helped lead Brillion to sectional final.

Maximus Nelson, Jr., Appleton North: 20.4 ppg., 10.5 rpg. Only player in the FVA to average a double-double, and made 62 3-pointers (35%).

Christopher Morgan, Jr., Kaukauna: 20.8 ppg., 6.7 rpg. First-team All-FVA, and made 76 of 195 3-point attempts (39%). Has offer from West Virginia.

Jacob Dietz, Sr., Neenah: 14 ppg., 5.3 rpg. First-team All-FVA and Unanimous member of FVA's all-defensive team.

Parker Lawrence, Sr., Hortonville: 19.7 ppg. First-team All-FVA, and scored in double figures in all but one game. Committed to St. Norbert.
