Series History (since 1960)

- ▶ Neenah leads the regular season series with Kaukauna 81-30.
- ▶ Neenah leads the post season series 3-1. Neenah beat Kaukauna in the regional 71-59 in 1963 and 77-60 in 1964. Kaukauna beat Neenah in the sectional 71-63 in 1997 and the Rockets returned the favor in the 1998 sectional by beating the Ghosts 53-42.
- ► The longest Neenah regular season win streak in the series is 23 games (1966-1979).
- ► The longest Kaukauna regular season win streak in the series is 6 games (2004-2006).
- ▶ Neenah's largest margin of victory (47 points) was in 1973 by the score of 95-48.
- ► Neenah's largest margin of defeat (30 points) was in 2012 by the score of 67-37.
- ▶ In the 115 total games that Neenah and Kaukauna have played since 1959-60, only 10 games have gone to overtime (seven of them since 2001). Two of those games happened in the same season (2008-09) when Neenah lost at home to Kaukauna 69-67, and then beat the Ghosts on the last night of the regular season in Kaukauna 76-72.

Tonight's Matchup



Tonight the Rockets welcome the state-ranked Galloping Ghosts of Kaukauna to the friendly confines of the Ron Einerson field house for a rare Saturday night FVA basketball game. Kaukauna is led by the dean of FVA coaches, Michael Schalow. Coach Schalow is now in his 23rd year of leadership of the Galloping Ghosts program. During his tenure he has taken the once down trodden program and made it one of the most consistent winning programs in the FVA. The Galloping Ghosts have finished .500 or higher for 14 consecutive seasons (second only to Oshkosh North's 22 consecutive seasons) and have won five FVA titles since 1997. On the court the Galloping Ghosts are led by West Virginia recruit Jordan McCabe. The senior leads the FVA in scoring by averaging 25 points per game. While his shot selection and interest in attempting fancy passes is certainly questionable at times, his ability to dribble the basketball is unparalleled to his high school competition. While McCabe gets a significant amount of media attention, Kaukauna is far from a one-man show. Arguably, the Galloping Ghosts are the most talented boys' basketball team on paper in state of Wisconsin regardless of division. They are the only school with three players listed in the annual Wisconsin Basketball Yearbook top 50 list. Fellow senior stars Eric Carl (#2, 6'5" guard) and Dylan Kurey (#32, 6'8" forward) add to the firepower of a team that has scored 85 or more points in six of their nine games this year. One more player to keep an eye on tonight is sophomore sharpshooter Keaton Ferris (#15, 5'10" guard) who is averaging 10 points per game for Kaukauna this season.

Tonight, the Rockets return to the hardwood for the first time in 15 days. The Rockets will now play three games in six days. After tonight's battle with Kaukauna, the Rockets will host Appleton East on Tuesday night and then travel to Oshkosh West to battle the Wildcats next Friday night. In their last game before the Christmas break, the Rocket defense gave up a season-high 85 points in the 85-78 loss to the undefeated Monona Grove Silver Eagles. For the Rockets to climb the standings during the next two months, they are going to have to become a better defensive team. Big Red has allowed 70 or more points in four of its nine games this year, with all four of those games resulting in a loss. The Rocket defense will certainly be challenged tonight facing the power of the Kaukauna Galloping Ghost offensive arsenal.

Turning Back the Clock

Tonight, we are looking back at a memorable battle between the Neenah Rockets and Kaukauna Galloping Ghosts that occurred on December 17, 1971 in Kaukauna. It was memorable for one main reason. Neenah head coach Ron Einerson was sidelined with mononucleosis. In his place stepped varsity assistant coach Rich Paske. Coach Paske admitted to the Post Crescent that he was nervous before the game. However, Coach Paske and Coach Einerson had worked out the game plan during the week in terms of strategy and substitution patterns. That strategy and substitution patterns were tested very early in the game when Neenah lost two key members of its team in the first quarter when starting guard Glen Rodgers left the game with the flu and forward Jim Vandenberg limped off the court with a sprained ankle. Nonetheless, the 5-1 Rockets got off to a blistering start from the field by outscoring the Galloping Ghosts 23-9 in the first quarter. Kaukauna battled back in the second quarter and cut the Rocket advantage to 11 when they went into the locker room for halftime trailing 37-26.

However, that would be the closest Kaukauna would get the rest of the night. Coach Paske must have provided a stirring halftime speech because Big Red put to rest any questions concerning the competitive portion of the game with a 23-10 run in the third quarter to take a commanding 60-36 lead after 24 minutes of competition. The fourth quarter consisted of both teams exchanging turnovers and baskets as the Rockets eventually closed out the Galloping Ghosts by a final score of 74-52.

For the game the Rockets shot 45 percent from the floor, forced 22 Kaukauna turnovers and dominated the boards with a 38-24 rebounding advantage. Neenah had a balanced scoring ledger with senior leaders Jim Crist (first-team all-FVA, 1972 FVA Player of the Year) and Ed Hawley (second-team all-FVA) each scoring 15 points. Fellow senior guard Dene Storch (first-team all-FVA) chipped in with 12 points. Neenah would finish the 1972 FVA season in second place with a record of 10-2, a game behind conference champion Kimberly.

In WIAA tournament action the Rockets buried Oshkosh West 89-57 and Menasha 61-42 before shooting over 60 percent to defeat a tough Appleton West squad 75-69 in the regional final. In the sectional, the Rockets defeated Mayville 50-43 and Ripon 65-53 to earn their fourth consecutive trip to the state tournament. In the state quarterfinal, Neenah defeated Kewaunee 81-65 behind 22 points from Storch. The next night the Rockets held on for a 59-57 win over Janesville Parker. Storch connected on consecutive free throws late in the fourth quarter to provide the winning two-point margin. In the state title game, the Rockets could not hold onto an 11-point second half lead and lost to Milwaukee Hamilton 58-52. Remarkably, this would be the third time that the Rockets would return to Neenah with the runner-up trophy since 1969 (Neenah brought home the third place trophy in 1971). Until January 9, when we welcome the Patriots of Appleton East, NEENAH WITH PRIDE!
