Tonight the Neenah Rockets return to the friendly confines of the Ron Einerson Fieldhouse to face head coach Adam Maulick and his red-hot Appleton East Patriots. The Patriots come into tonight's game victorious in five of their last six games with wins over Fond du Lac, Hortonville, Oshkosh North, Oshkosh West and SPASH. Coach Maulick is in his first season leading the Patriot program and has already won more conference games this year (seven) than Appleton East has won in any of the past four years. Rebuilding is nothing new for Coach Maulick as he spent his last four years coaching at Menasha where he made the Bluejays competitive, winning 34 games (for comparison, Menasha went a combined 34-230 in the 12 prior

seasons). The Patriots are led by a core group of seniors. Leading the charge is (#24, 6'4" guard) Kaden Clark who is averaging over 19 points a game this season. After tonight's game, Neenah will journey to Racine on Saturday to participate in the Wisconsin/Illinois Border Battle, travel to Oshkosh West next Tuesday for a makeup game and then trek to Fond du Lac next Friday to face the Cardinals. Neenah will conclude the regular season at home against Appleton North on Tuesday, February 19. Hard to believe that we are in the homestretch of the 2019 basketball season. Speaking of things hard to believe, the Rockets or shall we say "Running Rockets" are lighting up the scoreboard unlike anything this basketball program has seen in decades. Neenah's offensive fireworks in the last two games (86 in a defeat to Kaukauna, 94 in a win over Appleton

West) caused us to do some research. The last time Neenah scored over 80 points in consecutive conference games was in 1998 when the conference champion Rockets defeated state ranked powers Fond du Lac (82-70 in Neenah) and Oshkosh West (80-69 in Oshkosh) on consecutive nights on Valentine's Day weekend. How about the last time Neenah scored 94 or more points in a conference game? That happened twice in 1988 when Coach Einerson's state runner-up powerhouse defeated Appleton West 95-65 and Menasha 97-61. The last time the Rockets hit the century mark in a conference game was in the 1981 conference opener when the conference champion Rockets trampled the Kaukauna Galloping Ghosts 103-75. Just in case someone is wondering, the most points Neenah has ever scored in a conference game was in 1970 when the state runner-up Rockets exterminated the Green Bay Preble Hornets 126-75. That was Neenah's final season in the Fox River Valley Conference.

One final thought on tonight's game. Expect this game to be a battle for 36 minutes. When the Rockets defeated the Patriots in Appleton on January 5, that game was fiercely contested with numerous lead changes for the first 34 minutes, before the Rockets dominated with a closing run to finish the game. Expect a similar competitive ballgame tonight.

TURNING Back the Clock

Tonight, we are going back to the 1982 FVA season. Yet, to really appreciate the 1982 Rockets, we need to go back one season. In 1981, Neenah won the FVA with a 12-2 conference mark, finished the season with an overall record of 19-3, ranked fifth in the final state basketball poll. Neenah lost a lot to graduation heading into the 1982 season. Gone were first-team all-conference players Jeff Dehn, and Steve Coenen. In fact, out of the 1464 points scored during the 1981 season, only players who scored 74 total points would be returning. However, the FVA was beginning to learn the true magic of the Neenah basketball program was because of the depth of the total program. A number of players who had finished 14-2 for Neenah's 1981 Junior Reserve team were ready to step up and make plays for the 1982 Rockets.

Tonight we are reviewing the December 11, 1981 battle between Appleton East and Neenah. Both the Patriots and Rockets were expected to be two of the top four contenders for the conference title. Appleton East entered 2-0 in conference and 3-1 on the young season. The Rockets were perfect at 2-0 in league play and 4-0 overall. The game lived up to the hype. After eight minutes of action the score was tied at 10-10. Appleton East then demonstrated their scoring punch during the second quarter when they outscored the Rockets 18-6 to take a 28-16 advantage into halftime. The Patriots continued to dominate and extended their lead to 32-16 halfway through the third quarter. Then, the Neenah Rocket defense stepped up! By forcing turnovers and missed shots by the Patriots, the Rockets were able to chip away at the 16-point margin. Neenah had finally cut the deficit under 10 when it scored to make it 34-26 with 30 seconds to go in the third quarter. Next, one of the key plays of the game was made by Rocket senior guard Jeff Gerhardt. While Appleton East was holding for the last shot of the third quarter, Gerhardt stole the ball and raced the length of the court to make the layup and beat the buzzer. Neenah only trailed 34-28 heading into the decisive quarter.

With some game changing momentum, and sensing the fans in the Neenah fieldhouse were ready to explode, Coach Einerson's Big Red Machine jumped on the Patriots with a 12-4 run to start the fourth quarter and take the lead 40-38. The Patriots responded with a John Smith layup to tie it at 40-40 with 3:55 left in the game. However, these Rockets didn't erase a 16-point second half deficit to make the game competitive. Neenah responded with six consecutive points, including two free throws by senior first-team all-conference guard Omar Atassi. Later in the quarter, Atassi hit a jump shot to stretch the lead with 1:35 left in the game. The Patriots couldn't recover from the Rocket spurt and never got closer than three points. The final margin was a 50-44 win for the Rockets. This game would turn out to be a key win for the 1982 Rockets. Neenah would win the FVA title with a 12-2 conference mark. Appleton East would finish second at 10-4. The title was Neenah's seventh FVA title in eight seasons. The 1982 Rockets would finish their season 15-5. Until Tuesday, February 19 when we welcome the Lightning of Appleton North, NEENAH WITH PRIDE!
